Make a Butterfly Feeder



Get ready for the Big Butterfly Count by attracting butterflies to your school or home.



Colouring pens or pencils



Overripe, mushy fruit

What you'll need:



String



Paper plates

How to make your butterfly feeder.

Step 1:

Make four holes around the edge of your paper plate, making sure they're evenly spaced otherwise your feeder will be lopsided.

Step 2:

Tie four pieces of string through the holes, bringing them together at the top so you can hang your feeder on a branch.



Step 3:

If you'd like to, add some brightly coloured patterns to your plate using pens or pencils to attract even more butterfies!



Step 4:

Place your old mushy fruit on the plate (old bananas are a hit!) and hang your feeder near some bright flowers.

Wait for the butterflies to come and visit!
