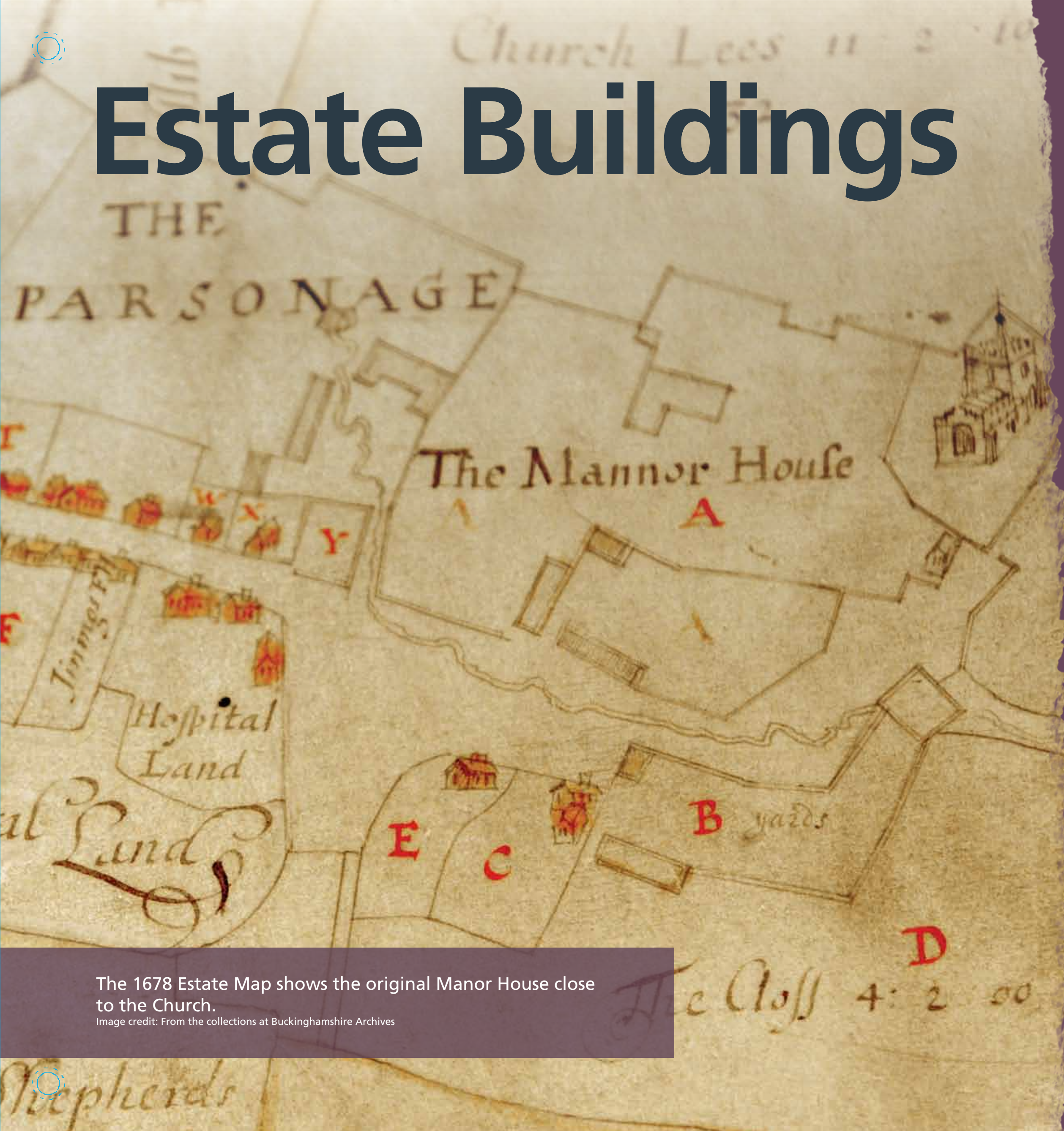


# Estate Buildings

## Growing Estate

These buildings are survivors of the estate of Great Linford Manor. The first Manor House was on the spot now occupied by the south Pavilion until, in the 1690s, it was demolished and the new Manor was built where you see it today.

## Changing Views

The Almshouses ahead of you were also built in the 1690s, with a school operating in the taller middle building. Perhaps unusual buildings to find on a private estate?

Medieval Great Linford village extended down this slope, with tenanted homes on both sides. To create the Pleasure Gardens these were all removed. The remains of medieval dwellings can be found under several parts of the Park.



The Buckinghamshire Otter Hounds were housed in kennels where the current Arts Centre workshops stand.
