



## KS1 & 2: Seasonal Walks

This outline is a general guide for what to expect during your session with us. Activities and session structure may vary depending on weather conditions and other circumstances.

<ul> <li>Exploration and investigation of the local environment and learning about your chosen site.</li> <li>Identification of native animals and plants, particularly those still found during your chosen season</li> <li>Understanding of the interactions between living organisms in the local environment</li> <li>Observation of the natural world through a series of activities</li> <li>Team work to complete challenges</li> </ul>	Introduction The class will have a brief welcome and introduction to the day. We will discuss the time of year and what wildlife will be doing during this season.  Activities Seasonal Walks is an exploration of our green spaces throughout the various seasons. The session will consist of finding and learning about our native wildlife in a fun and interactive style. Throughout the experience, there will be nature related challenges to bring participants closer to the natural world. This session will be hands on and include fun facts and activities in a local park of your choice.	To include: Discussion with children before, during and at the end of the visit – to include impromptu "quiz" questions throughout the walk, and a revision of the topics we have covered.
