The parks are home to nearly 30 pieces of public art. Many pieces can be found in Campbell Park, as the original vision for the park saw it as being the cultural heart of the city.

Some pieces can be found in new areas of parkland, like the Ashland snake and some sculptures have been able to call their park home for over 20 years, like the Triceratops at Peartree Bridge.
